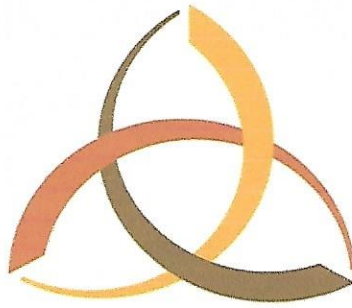

## Board of Directors

### Minutes - Amended

May 19, 2020

#### Preparing to Do Our Work

The meeting was opened at 6:40p with a welcome to members. Jesse Clayton read Our Agreements. Vice-Moderator Becky McDonough opened with a prayer.

Established a Quorum: 7/8 members present were Brock, Clayton, Daniels, Kane, King, Mintz, McDonough LOA: Botelho Guests: None

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#### Our Role as a Working Board

The following reports (see attached) were submitted for approval:

Minutes of the April 21 and May 12, 2020 Board meetings; Pastor's Report, Financials, Building and Grounds, and Pastor Evaluation. Fuzzy Mintz made a motion to accept reports, seconded by Kathy King, and approved unanimously.

Jack Botelho submitted his resignation from the Board of Directors. Rev. Lillie Brock will announce this at next Sunday's service. Plans to honor and thank you will be made based on how this Covid-19 Pandemic progress. Becky McDonough made a motion to accept the resignation, seconded by David Daniels, and approved unanimously. Rev. Lillie will announce his resignation during service on May 31<sup>st</sup>, Becky will send Jack a card from the Board, and a story in the newsletter will be done for the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday in June. At Jack's request, the Board will not announce in the Newsletter.

Jesse Clayton submitted an additional need for lighting on campus, based on rounds with a Manatee County Sheriff. This would have more lighting at rear of buildings and storage sheds. Estimated cost would be \$350. Money to cover this will come from Combination of Building & Property Repairs and Contingency Funds. David Daniels made the motion for additional lighting, seconded by Kathy king, and unanimously accepted.

Rev. Lillie Brock stated Manatee Pride had been cancelled and she was going to get in touch with them regarding the \$6000.00 we donated to be the event sponsor. The choices were to let the donation stay, ask for reimbursement of the whole amount, or to share it 50/50. Manatee Pride appears to be in decent financial shape. After much discussion, Jesse Clayton made a motion to have Manatee Pride accept it as a deposit this year to be the event sponsor next year, seconded by Becky McDonough, and passed unanimously.

David Daniels stated we did get a PPP grant on the second round. Bob Terra is working on the schedule for pay out. He also noted while we were over budget by \$5,138.35 for April, the Plate Analysis showed we met plate for the first quarter months and also for April. This has continued the first 3 weeks

of May as well. Given that the campus has been closed, we have had little income from programs and fundraising. When adjusted, we are below budget by \$1,576.66 – a truly amazing position. Attendance at virtual services and virtual programs are up!!

The Bequest donation for FELT was tabled by consensus again until next meeting.

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### **Our Role as a Strategic Body**

At our last meeting, Rev. Lillie Brock had proposed suspending work on our 2020 Strategic Priorities for this interim period connected with the COVID Pandemic. She provided a set of 2020 Strategic Priorities for the Covid-19 interim, focusing on building the infrastructure and ministry for a virtual church and initiating orientation and conversations for what the future can be for us. These working strategies do not eliminate the campus nor our original Strategic Priorities. The Board unanimously affirmed using these Strategic Priorities during this interim period.

The Board discussed the Options for Board Elections. At this point in time with the Covid19 demands regarding the Church, it is unlikely that we can continue the conversation with the Congregation on process and procedure for change the bylaws for this next election. Rev. Lillie will address this with the Congregation in her scheduled Pastor Chat on June 1<sup>st</sup>. Once we are through this pandemic, we will address the issue as a priority.

From our discussion at the May 12 meeting, Rev. Lillie provided an overview of virtual programs (see attached) covering one-time pop-up groups, ongoing virtual group expansion, church-wide events online and on campus, and possibly the community with our community partners. The schedule for June is attached.

Our sister church in Venice, Suncoast Cathedral, completed a check-in survey of their Congregation regarding this Coronavirus experience and expectations for resuming in-person Church experiences. Suncoast has provided us with a copy and permission to use. After review, we decided to add 2 questions on what have they done and what do they plan to attend, i.e. June programs etc. The last question is when do they watch the Sunday sermon? Rev. Lillie will discuss this at her Pastor Chat on June 1<sup>st</sup> and we will send it out the next day.

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### **Our Role as a Governance Body**

Marilyn Kane and Doug Berger developed the attached Communications Policy for Emergent, Urgent and/or Critical Situations to describe, codify and expand the policies and procedures used during the start of this Covid19 Pandemic for communications for information and actions internally and externally. Motion to approve by David Daniels, second by Kathy King, and passed unanimously.

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### **Leaving to Serve**

#### **Outstanding Items:**

Marilyn Kane updated the Hot Topics-Parking Lot. See attached.

David Daniels reviewed the current situation with our audit being done in May. He called the auditor to check on progress and the auditor self-stated he is not licensed or trained to do an audit but will complete a review by July 15, not May as promised. The term audit was used consistently in oral and written communication with him. After discussion of our needs, David will call our Accountant, Bob Terra to inform him, and then collect our materials from the "auditor."

## Position Statement

### Racism and White Supremacy in America and in the Church

***God has not given us a spirit of fear, but the spirit of power, of courage and resolution, to meet difficulties and dangers; the spirit of love which will carry us through opposition.” 2 Timothy 1:7***

At Church of the Trinity Metropolitan Community Church, we were founded on the precepts of inclusion, diversity and Christian Social Action. Today, in the face of unprecedented acts of racism and white supremacy in our country, we find ourselves called to look inside ourselves and find a way to stand in the place where we **should be** . . . with the peaceful protesters, taking a knee, listening to the stories of African American people, crying with the mothers who have lost their sons and grieving with the daughters and sons who have lost their fathers.

We stand in the place where we should be . . .

Searching and learning how to face our own white privilege and racists actions.

**Confessing** the time that we have turned the other way or were tone deaf, just because we could.

**Lending** our voices of whiteness and privilege to move toward the dismantling of racist systems and structures that plague this nation at every turn.

**Speaking** out against anything that would cause our black siblings to say, “I Can’t Breathe.”

We take our place in following Jesus by saying a “Holy NO” to any who might use religion or our houses of worship to sell goods and ideas that are for their own purposes. We recommit ourselves to walking humbly, remaining prayerful, and always seeking justice for the least of these.

Hello friends and colleagues,

I'm writing today because I have made an important decision that will impact all of you. Given the events of the last week around racism and white supremacy, I've struggled with what the church needs to do in the form of real action while also remembering our role as a faith community. After a lot of prayer and thought, I've decided that we should expand the intention of our bonfire on June 10 to include our prayers for the black community, for those lost to violence, for those who are not heard, for those who have lost so much, for the system of racism that continually hurts the black community and for justice. To that end, here is what I am thinking:

1. June 10th is soon enough (at first, I was afraid that would be waiting too long) because Goerge Floyd's funeral and memorial services are Tuesday and Thursday of next week so the 10th would fall right between them.
2. I have prepared a shorter version of my video reflection yesterday that Carole will be sending to news outlets so I'm hoping that will result in an interview where I can let the city know we are doing this.
3. We can invite other churches to join us and start with the Interfaith list we have from the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service. We can also ask other congregations to make and bring prayer ties to join with ours.
4. We have made the decision (even before this) to invest in a sound system that can accommodate outside events AND an FM broadcast system that will allow folks who need to stay in their cars the ability to turn to and FM station and hear everything that is going on.
5. The imagery of the smoke lifting prayers AS WELL AS giving breath to them will be very meaningful.
6. It is good that the prayer tie ritual is not a Christian one so that we can be all the more inclusive.
7. Joffrey, the drumming circle will be all the more important. Ollie, we may need you to sing.

Please be thinking about all your pieces and parts as we look to have a bigger crowd and expanded audience.

Thank you for supporting me in leading our church outside our walls and into the streets.

Let's stand in the place where we SHOULD!

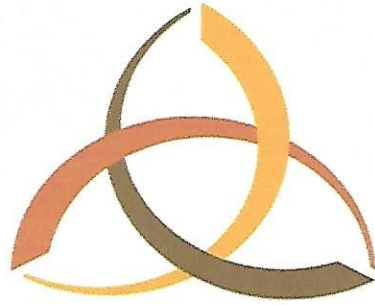
